## Out of Wedlock Births

U.S – increased from 6% to 37% of births

Sweden & Norway – now more than 50%

Denmark – now 45%

# Divorce

20 Years after the Pill, U.S. divorce rate reached 250% of what it had been

50% of contracepting couples eventually divorce

# Decline of Marriage

Record low rates of marriage

865% increase in unmarried cohabitation

Fathers & Mothers with children went from 45%  
to 26% of all households

Only 35 percent of adults now consider children  
an important component of marriage.

Violent Crime Up 500%

Imprisonment Up 500%

Greatest predictor of criminality is the family status of children

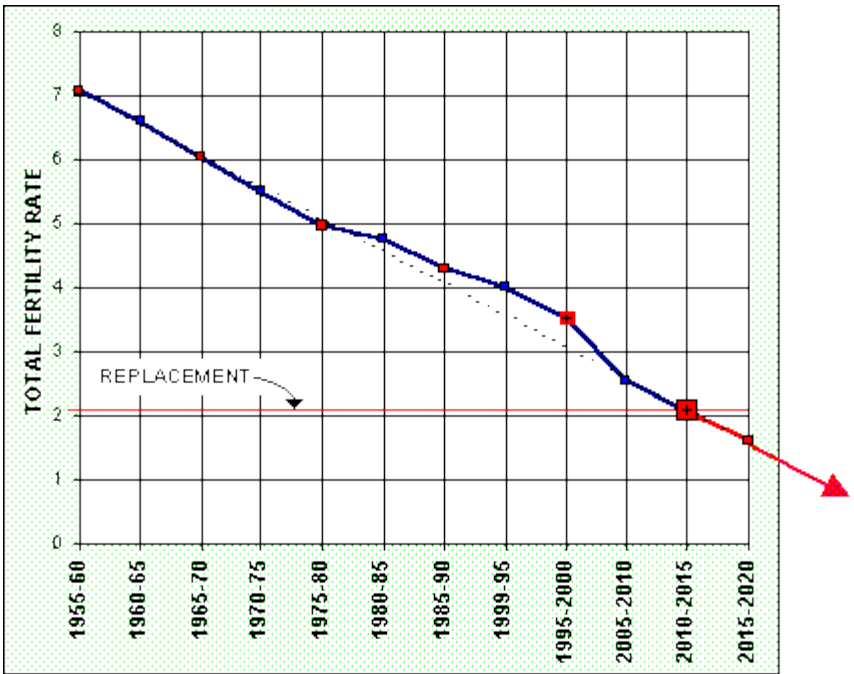
# Depopulation

Many countries in the world are literally dying out

Spain, Italy, Germany, Russia, Japan, China and others will lose more than half their population this century

# **PHILIPPINES: DECLINING TOTAL FERTILITY RATE**

Since 1955,  
Philippine TFR has been dropping by about ONE CHILD PER DECADE. With this trend, the earliest estimated date for Zero Population Growth Fertility Rate is between 2010-2015 AD. To avert Philippine demographic suicide, this downward trend will have to be reversed by the difficult return to a pro-baby culture.



# Abortion

All contraceptive societies eventually  
legalize abortion

Most popular contraceptives sometimes  
cause very early abortions

Contraceptives have a high failure rate in  
actual use

So, half of unintended pregnancies occur  
among contraceptive users

# Sexually Transmitted Infections

Britain – 400,000 NEW cases of STI's in  
2007, a new record

U.S. – 3 million NEW cases of  
Chlamydia, 1 of 20 STD's, per annum  
1.2 million of these among teens

# AIDS

Edward C. Green, senior research scientist, Harvard School of Public Health: “there is no evidence that more condoms leads to less AIDS.”

Dr. Norman Hearst, UCSF: statistics show pattern of increased condom sales correlating with rising HIV prevalence

# AIDS

Disparity in the effectiveness of Thailand Method (Condoms) and the Philippines Method (Abstinence & Faithfulness)

Parameter	Thailand	Philippines
Adults & Children Living with HIV	570,000	9,000
AIDS Deaths in 2003	58,000	500
Population	62,833,000	79,999,000
HIV Infection Rates Per Million	9,072	113

# Economic Stagnation

Population growth is the historical driver  
of economic development

Japan stagnating because its population  
no longer growing

# Impoverished Elderly

Both the Asian Development Bank and the UN have issued statements that indicate the elderly in developing East Asia could become destitute because the populations are aging faster than they are developing

# Government Bankruptcy

# Prostitution

About 240 underage girls are transported into the Kansas City metro area every month to be prostituted. Kansas City is not even in the top 25 largest urban areas of the U.S. It has been estimated that up to 300,000 children in the U.S. are at risk of commercial sexual exploitation. This doesn't even consider adult prostitutes.

# Sexual Chaos

In the U.S, during a typical week, according to an authoritative polling firm, 38 percent of adults younger than 25 engaged in sex outside of marriage, 33 percent viewed pornography and 25 percent got drunk.

# Sexual Chaos

A recent study in the UK revealed three leading potential "triggers" for serious mental health problems in girls:  
premature sexualisation,  
commercialization, and alcohol abuse.

# Sexual Chaos

A 2007 report of the American Psychological Association found evidence that the proliferation of sexualized images of girls and young women in advertising, merchandising, and media is harmful to girls' self-image and healthy development.

# Withering Christianity

For more than a thousand years, Europe was known as Christendom. Today, 16 percent, 14 percent, and 13 percent, respectively, of the British, French and Germans consider religion very important.

# Withering of the Church

Researchers estimate that the percentage of adults in the U.S. who actually attend religious services during the previous weekend dropped from 42% in 1965 to 26% in 1994.

# Withering of the Church

In Ireland, the Archdiocese of Dublin, the capital city, ordained only one priest in 2004. In 2005, for the first time in what historians say is hundreds of years, the diocese did not expect to ordain a single priest.

# Dissolution of Society

Noted sociologist Pitirim Sorokin, who founded the Sociology department at Harvard University, found in his studies no culture surviving once it ceased to support marriage and monogamy."

## Dissolution of Society

J.D. Unwin, anthropologist, studied 86 cultures that stretched across 5,000 years. He found when they restricted sex to marriage they thrived. But not one culture survived more than three generations after turning sexually permissive. Unwin had no Christian convictions: "I offer no opinion about rightness or wrongness." "In human records there is no instance of a society retaining its energy after a complete new generation has inherited a tradition which does not insist on pre-nuptial and post-nuptial continence."
